John Clarkson, Sierra Leone's Moses.

In 1792 John Clarkson, Thomas Clarkson's younger brother, took over 1000 black Loyalists from Canada to the new settlement of Sierra Leone. John is less talked about than Thomas and Liz tells us something about his part in the abolition of the slave trade
